2018 Youth Poster Contest

Sponsored by the National Membership Committee

(New Contest Period: Contest ends August 17, 2018)

The USPS Youth Poster Contest Awards promote youth appreciation and respect for recreational boating, and the message that safe boating is always fun boating.

The Contest is open to children ages 6–14, which is divided into three age groups:

1) Ages 6 – 8 2) Ages 9 – 11 3) Ages 12 – 14

Squadrons should conduct local contests and submit winning posters to their respective District for judging. Posters submitted to the National Membership Committee for judging must be endorsed by each District Poster/Membership Chair as the point of contact.

The 2018 Poster Theme:

"America's Boating Club Saves Lives"

Artwork should illustrate how safe boating through education, on the water skills, and proper use of equipment save lives.

Rules

- Each district may submit one poster in each age category.
- Each entry must be submitted on poster board or heavy construction paper; size 15"x20" or 14"x22"
- Entries must be judged at the district level to select winning entries for submission at the National contest level.
- Squadron and District judging deadlines are a local decision.
- Only District First-Place winners in each age category will be accepted for judging at the National level.
- Posters may be sketched lightly with pencil, but the result must be in color suitable for photography.
- Professional illustrations, photos, copyrighted or trademark material, purchased or computer generated are not allowed and will disqualify the entry.
- Posters must not to be folded.
- Posters will be judged on the Theme, message and artistic representation.
- Only one entry per person is allowed. All entries become the property of the United States Power Squadrons, which reserves the right to display and reproduce.
- Contest entry forms must be complete, legible, and attached to the back of their poster.
- Annual Contest entries must now be delivered to the Fall Governing Board Meeting. This year's meeting will be held in Minneapolis, MN. Posters must be received by Friday, 17 August 2018, for judging.
- First, Second and Third Place Winners will be announced for each age category during the Minneapolis Meeting. Awards are underwritten by a grant from the OMC Foundation.

New SOBOS App May Save Lives

It may sound strange to put an app on your phone to provide information about your safe boating day until you realize that it will help understand events surrounding boating accident reports. The app is called SOBOS (Self-Reported On-Water Boat Operator Survey) and it is based on the premise that more information about "normal", non-accident based recreational boater data would enhance our ability to better understand recreational boating accidents and methods for mitigating those accidents. The project involves asking recreational boat operators to fill out an anonymous short survey (approx. 5-10 min) and then permit anonymous location captures during a short span of their next cruise. Again, both the survey and on-water data points are completely de-identified and all contributions are anonymous.

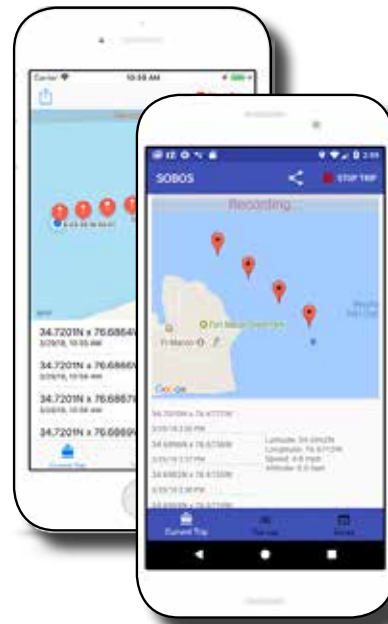
SOBOS is a public health-public service project designed to reduce recreational boating accidents & fatalities by leveraging the power of social networking to examine the recreational boating characteristics. The difference between the SOBOS mobile tool and a chart plotter is that the data will be stacked recreational boating data including: day, time, latitude/longitude, & boat speed coupled with the anonymous survey. Partners benefit thru data to study geospatial distributions, actuarial research, or boating accident research when these non-accident data are compared with local recreational boating accidents. Such research leads to safer recreational boating resulting in evidence based public health approach follow-up actions such as:

- Considering the update of marine rules and regulations (perhaps locally instead of nationally focused) on accident risks rather than one size fits all scenarios
- Better risk factor identification can lead to new boating technology related risk reduction or mitigation (e.g., collision avoidance systems in new cars)
- Better risk factor identification can lead to improved focus on specific boat operator behavior modification that lower overall risk
- Social Networking (e.g., SOBOS) can provide a means of alerting or post-processing boating accident risks enabling boat operators to consider corrective actions

- Data analytics that can yield space-time patterns that provide a clearer understanding as well as valuable information about both safe and non-safe boat operator habits and behaviors

In summary, there are not many ways not already tried to reduce recreational boating accidents and fatalities. SOBOS could be the technological leap needed to move the needle; if you are willing to assist.

As a member of America's Boating Club your participation in this public service project will allow the collection of data via a short survey and a portion of your next boating trip. Your cell phone records the anonymous location data (waypoints) and appends



the anonymous survey to each location, so record keeping is minimal. It's an opportunity to enjoy being on the water while helping build the knowledge-base of normal boaters' activities. Our own Past Chief Commander, Ernie Marshburn, PhD and many other boating organizations that we are familiar with are participating in this effort. Please join these groups in helping move the boating accident/fatality needle further down the scale.

As currently planned SOBOS will be available May 1, 2018 to allow boaters to register and begin helping build recreational boating data specific to a day, time, latitude/longitude, and speed. This data will add anonymous non-accident-based on-water recreational boater data to study aspects beyond the limited information provided in the boating accidents reports. Please consider helping the recreational boating community through this crowd sourcing effort. Look for more information soon at www.SOBOS.org for additional details.

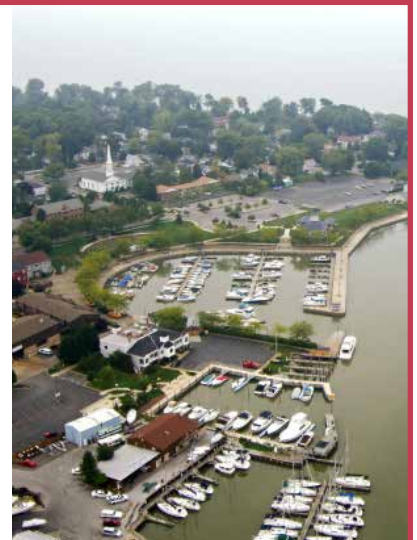

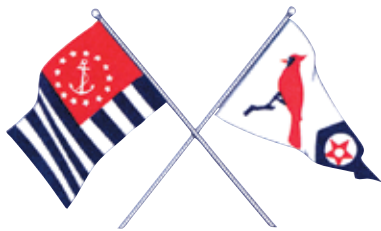
