

After a particularly long winter, boating season is finally upon us! By now you have pulled out your boat from storage and started on the task of buffing and cleaning your vessel. After you are done, it looks great, but is it safe for the season or are there some issues lurking to detract from your days on the lake? Don't forget your complementary Vessel Safety Check to ensure you are ready for the coming boating season.



What is it?

This courtesy Vessel Safety Check (VSC) is performed at your boat – whether in a slip, at the launch ramp, or in your driveway – by a certified Vessel Examiner, at a mutually-convenient time, and usually takes 30 to 45 minutes, depending upon the size of your boat. Best of all – it is FREE!

What's in it For Me?

Boats that pass the examination are awarded a distinctive VSC Decal that alerts the Coast Guard, Harbor Patrol, and

other law-enforcement agencies that your boat was found to be in full compliance with all Federal and State boating laws. Frequently, such agencies will not detain or board boats displaying a current-year decal that are otherwise operating safely.

What If I Don't Pass?

If your boat does not pass, no report is filed and no tickets are issued. Instead, you are provided a written report that aids you in correcting any discrepancies noted. Often, a quick trip to the local marine store is all that is necessary to obtain missing safety items and easily pass a re-inspection.

Why Do This?

In a word – safety. You are left with the peace of mind that your boat meets minimum safety standards. Also, if an emergency arises you will have the necessary equipment to save lives and summon help. Additionally, you will avoid substan-



tial fines should you ever be boarded by law enforcement and found to be in violation of said laws. Finally, your insurance rates may be lowered – check with your agent. It is FREE!

Eight Bells— Change of Watch

Before the advent of the chronometer, time at sea was measured by the trickle of sand through a half-hour glass. One of the ship's boys had the duty of watching the glass and turning it when the sand had run out. When he turned the glass, he struck the bell as a signal that he had performed this vital function. From this ringing of the bell as the glass was turned evolved the tradition of striking the bell once at the end of the first half hour of a four hour watch, twice after the first hour, etc., until eight bells marked the end of the four-hour watch. The process was repeated for the succeeding watches. This age-old practice of sounding the bell on the hour and half hour has its place in the nuclear and missile oriented United States Navy at the dawn of the Twenty-First Century, regulating daily routine, just as it did on our historic vessels under sail in the late Eighteenth Century.

Dear Nautical Professor.

I want to do some work on my boat's 12-volt electrical system and my dock mate told me to disconnect the battery cables before working on the system. Does it make any difference which one I disconnect first? It seems to me that I should take the red one off first because that is the hot one. Please advise. — Flash

Dear Flash,

When working on your boats 12-volt negative ground system always disconnect the negative (black) battery lead first, thereby eliminating the potential of a direct short to ground, causing your wires to melt and inflecting serious burns to your body. When reconnecting your system, do so in the reverse order connecting the red, positive lead, first and the black, negative lead, last.

If you would like to learn more about your boats electrical system I suggest that you take the USPS seven week Marine Electrical System course. It covers various aspects of alternating current (AC) and direct current (DC) power on recreational boats, plus corrosion and troubleshooting. — NP
