Hi! My name is Sue Nadolson, AP and I would like to introduce myself as your librarian. Over the next year, I hope to complete the inventory of the books that grace the CSPS's shelves, and familiarize myself with the video library, self study learning guides, etc.

In this issue of the Galley Gossip, I would like to start a new column titled "OFF THE SHELF". It will feature excerpts from books, videos or self study guides of interest that the Squadron has available for check out or purchase. This month and most likely the next few, I would like to introduce you to the book, COUNT LUCKNER—THE SEA DEVIL by Lowell Thomas that was published in 1927. This book is the biography of the Sea Devil's adventures in the South Atlantic and the Pacific in the early 1900s during the World War. Although the Count was considered a buccaneer by the Allied Forces, he was nevertheless highly respected by the British Navy and even honored by the Pope in Rome. As a Commander, his sailing abilities were unparalled and adventures highly amazing. I would like to quote the last page written in the Count's own words to the Youth Of America nearly one hundred years ago: "As an old sailor who has sailed before the mast around this world many times, I want to tell you Americans how lucky you are to live in a great country occupying a large part of this continent, with the wide Atlantic for a barrier on one side and the Pacific on the other. Yours is a great inheritance. You should be proud of it. You should make yourselves worthy of it. It is my dream that one day we shall all speak the same language and have so many common interests that terrible wars will no longer occur. But keep your bodies fit, and if your country needs you, just remember the motto of the sea: "Don't jump overboard! Stay with the ship!"

ing change to be able to report some positive news on these fronts.

The leadership of both the Columbus and national USPS has been seeking ways to generate more value added benefits for our members. With this in mind, a new effort has been concluded with the very recent announcement that USPS and US Sailing have signed a

memorandum of understanding that outlines how the two organizations can share educational resources, including programs and course materials.

The move allows each group to tap into the other organization's particular expertise. This collaboration was highly encouraged by the United States Coast Guard in the hope of ensuring a higher level of competency and safety among boaters. Blending USPS's class room offerings with US Sailing's on-the-water training programs will offer powerful education and training options for both memberships. Enriching each group's ability to provide in-depth boating knowledge will allow certification opportunities that were here-to-for unavailable.

Another break through for the recreational boater occurred in September when congress finally approved the Water Resources Development Act by a wide margin. \$23.2 billion is dedicated to be spent on projects across the Great Lakes. Of special interest is mandating and funding what is now the temporary Asian carp barrier on the Chicago River. Other regulations call for study and action to deal with invasive species. Long neglected, there is also a provision that requires the Army Corps of Engineers to catch up on long overdue dredging of numerous harbors and navigation channels. Great news, long awaited. More details can be found in the current issue of Great Lakes Boating.

Now that boating season is past we are looking forward to classes next year. Please make your choices from the member courses listed elsewhere in the Galley Gossip. The Squadron Boating Course will begin Monday evening February 25 at Grandview Heights High School. Tracy Garrett has been instrumental again this year in securing this excellent site for us. Participation in this course is an especially good opportunity for new members to get to know some of the 'old timers'. We always need volunteers to help past out materials, grade papers, etc. Feel free to stop by any Monday evening and lend a hand for as little or as long as you like. Most of the teaching staff remains the same. Bob Van Der Wissel has agreed to take over the materials taught by Joe Hetzel. Joe has decided to step back and let some of the newer members try their hand. Thanks again Joe, for all the great teaching hours you have given. Jeff Mirgon will chair the Squadron Boating Course again this year and has been doing a great job. We list the Squadron Boating Course as the Squadron Boating Skills Course in our literature. National has reminded us that the public has grown weary of hearing about boating safety. They have found that boaters and potential boaters all consider



themselves safe boaters. However we all recognize we could use some help in improving our boating skills. We will be working hard at the boat shows to pass out literature advertising the course. Michael Hughes and Tracy Garrett have come up with some great ideas to attract interest of the boat show attendees.

We are continuing to work on our remote education effort.

It appears that the technical difficulties that we encountered in the past can be overcome. Larry Whiting has arranged for us to partner with The Ohio State University to try our first remote education class. Larry, is it true that anyone who signs up for the remote class at OSU qualifies for season football tickets for next year? We will keep you informed as this project progresses.

Hey Matey!

If the electrical system and the electronic gadgets on your boat are a mystery to you, come to the Marine Electronic class and let us help take the mystery away. We won't make you an electronic geek, but we can make you feel comfortable with all of those little black boxes and colorful wires. Then when the lights flicker and the screens go blank in the middle of the lake, you won't press the panic button. The class doesn't start until Feb 5, 2008. Contact Dave Clark at (614-891-4120) (clark.32@osu.edu) so we can have the manuals for you on the first night of class.

The Marine Electronics Course consists of three modules: ME 101, Boat Electrical Systems, ME 102, Marine Radio Communications, and ME 103, Marine Electronics for Navigation. There are no prerequisites for any of these modules; however, it is suggested that a member take ME 101 before taking ME 102. All three modules must be successfully completed to receive credit for Marine Electronics.

ME 101, Boat Electrical Systems, provides information about properties of electricity, electrical power requirements and wiring practices, direct current power, alternating current power,

galvanic and stray-current corrosion, lightning protection, and electrical interference.

ME 102, Marine Radio Communications, delves into radio waves and transmitters, receivers and transceivers, antennas and transmission lines, FCC Rules and Regulations,

FCC Frequency Plan, marine radiotelephone operating procedures, and other communication services (Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacon (EPIRB), Digital Selective Calling (DSC), Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (GMDSS), satellite communications, amateur radio, and more).

ME 103, Marine Electronics for Navigation, presents information on depth sounders, RADAR, LORAN-C, GPS Navigation, and two new chapters: Electronic Charting, and Computer-Assisted Navigation (CAN). Members may take this module independent of any other ME module.
