



This has been a rough year for our educational endeavors, and it looks like it will continue to be rough waters for the foreseeable future. We will be looking into a full schedule of classes for next year and how best to present them. We will keep you posted on developments for educational opportunities. Those who have just completed the ABC may investigate taking Boat Handling online.
