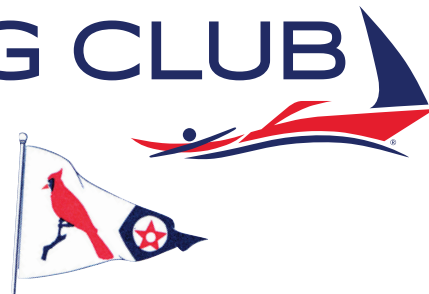

Marine Navigation (Formerly Piloting):

As the next step from ABC & Boat Handling, you can learn the essentials of safe coastal and inland navigation using basic GPS in conjunction with charts and other marine data including traditional dead reckoning techniques for planning/laying out safe routes, as well as ensuring that you are on-course while underway.

Celestial Navigation (Formerly Navigation

– prerequisites include Boat Handling, Marine Navigation, Advanced Marine Navigation and Offshore Navigation)

Learn navigation using all the celestial bodies! Prerequisites are ABC/NASBLA Course, Marine Navigation, Advanced Marine Navigation and Offshore Navigation.

Marine Electrical Systems

Does your boat have a battery? Radio? Stereo? Lights? Radar? GPS or chart plotter? Need to



charge your phone or see your dash at night? None of that works unless you have solid electrical systems. This course will cover the basics to enable you to tackle or better equip you to guide the install/repair of your boats electrical systems.

Marine Radar is a new course, developed

by members of our Canadian Power Squadron partners. We plan to do a self-study program with a handful of us planning to attend. Let me know if you're interested in attending these sessions (targeted at 5 weeks).

HIGHWAY CLEAN-UP PROJECT

As a squadron, we adopted a busy stretch of highway on Route 23 right in front of the Delaware Dam. We've always had 8-10 of us regulars to clean, but numbers have been waning due to the business of life and other conflicts. For the most recent clean-up event, my daughter had to work and my wife isn't all that mobile right now, leaving just Commander Dick and I to clean the entire stretch. We, of course, kicked posterior and loaded many bags, but consistent and diverse participation is needed to make this worthwhile community service project successful.

Please contact me if you want to arrange a group event – you need not be a club member to participate – or if there is a date that a number of members would like to target for the next clean-up activity. We typically operate on Sunday mornings – since that is the lowest traffic volume day and time of the day. The State of Ohio relies on highway adoption to allow funds to be allocated to other areas. Some stats from the State:

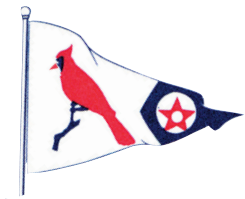
Together We Can Make A Difference - The Adopt-A-Highway Program began during the summer of 1989 and went statewide in March of 1990. Since 1989, thousands of volunteers have joined forces through ODOT's Adopt-A-Highway program to help keep Ohio's scenic views clean. Each year, ODOT spends an average of \$5 million specifically on litter removal. Highway cleanup volunteers enable ODOT to save taxpayer dollars and allow communities and residents of Ohio to help keep their state clean and free from litter. The program allows ODOT work crews more time to devote to their core functions, including road maintenance and construction projects. Each group that adopts a highway saves ODOT approximately \$800 in litter pick up costs per year.
