Well, this is the time of the year when we all think about our boats--either launching, selling or purchasing a new one. I am not in the mood entirely, but we went to the Catawba Island Club Boat Show on Saturday, April 29. As in the past, there were a lot of nice boats, however, it was raining and really cold and not a good day to enjoy a nice boat show.

The life jacket will be painted on the Delaware Dam once again this year on June 29th, with a rain date of the following day. Please contact Larry Lowe if you could assist. The Army Corp of Engineers will be supplying the paint and, along with the life jacket, there will be a red castle painted as well. This is a great project as there are hundreds, if not thousands, of people who see this painting along SR 23. This is a very impressive site on which to display the squadron's



name and life jacket for every motorist and boater who passes by to see.

May 20th is the start of Safe Boating Week and our Vessel Safety Examiners will be at the Hollenback Ramp on Saturday, May 20, beginning at 8:00 AM. Please stop by to either help or say hi, and please

bring your boat to have it inspected by one of the squadron's VSE's.

There will also be a "Wear It" group photograph at 10:00 AM at the boat launch ramp. Come out and help the National Safe Boating Council break the Guinness World Record for life jacket wear this year.

Boating season is now upon us. As you ready your boat, be sure to check the expiration dates of your safety items. Fire extinguishers not only have dates, but also a pressure gauge. These are so important that I have two on my boat; you never know if one will fail or you may



need both to contain a fire. Also, check your first aid kit to make sure that it is well stocked and that nothing in it is expired.

Boaters can enhance their enjoyment and safety by ensuring that their vessels are in compliance with all state and federal laws. One of the best, easiest, and most efficient ways to accomplish this task is to take advantage of the Vessel Safety Check Program. Vessel Safety Examinations are voluntary, but highly recommended and encouraged and endorsed by the United States Coast Guard. These examinations are conducted by Vessel Safety Examiners who are specially trained and certified.

A Vessel Safety Examiner, at no cost, will be happy to examine your boat or personal watercraft (examinations of personal watercraft are especially important due to the number of incidents involving such craft). The examiner will go thru the basic requirements of proper safety equipment, registration display and documentation, the requirements for and condition of personal floatation devices, visual and audio distress signals, fire extinguishers, proper ventilation procedures, maintenance issues, navigational lights and trash placards.

He or she will also be attentive to issues involving the use of marine radio equipment and licensing requirements, first aid supplies, fueling procedures, and a host of other items. Successfully passing an examination allows the boat or personal watercraft owner to display a sticker designating that the owner has successfully complied with all applicable laws. However, even those owners who do not pass the examination should not be discouraged as the Vessel Safety Examiner will recommend actions (with only the most positive of comments) to make your boat or watercraft fully compliant. When the issues have been successfully addressed, the boat or personal watercraft can be re-examined and a sticker awarded at that time.

Vessel Safety Examiners are easy to work with and informative. Have your vessel examined for your own peace of mind, and for the safety and enjoyment of your friends, families, and guests. It's easy; it's simple! Just do it! To arrange a free vessel safety examination please visit www.columbussailandpower.org.
