Dear Larroweise,

I installed a new VHF/DSC radio on my boat last summer but it doesn't do the things it is advertised to do. It just works like my old one. What else do I need to buy to make it work right? - Puzzled Boater

Dear Puzzled Boater,

It sounds like you haven't obtained your MMSI# and installed it into your radio. After you have done this I'm sure it will function as advertised. I also highly recommend interfacing your GPS to your radio so you can be found quickly by the Coast Guard when you need them. If you need more information or assistance with this I recommend calling a marine electronics technician or, attend the USPS Marine Communications class, where you will learn how to obtain your MMSI# and install it into your radio and interface your GPS plus how to operate your VHF/DSC radio, and introduce you to single side band radios, satellite communications, EBIRBS, and a whole lot more. I see that there is a class starting in your area on March 27 at 8492 Cotter Street, Lewis Center, OH. See you in class.





Spring Forward Take time for prelaunch checks

Check the following items before launching your boat this spring:

- I. Inspect and lubricate seacocks.
- 2. Inspect and replace hoses and hose clamps as needed.
- 3. Replace deteriorated zincs.
- 4. Inspect props for dings, pitting and distortion. Make sure cotter pins are secure. Grip the prop and try moving the shaft; if it's loose, the cutlass bearing may need to be replaced.
- 5. Make sure the rudderstock isn't bent.
- 6. Inspect the hull for blisters, distortions and stress cracks.
- 7. Make sure the engine intake sea strainer is corrosion-free and properly secured.
- 8. Check the engine shaft and rudder stuffing boxes for looseness. After launch, recheck these items and through-hulls for leaks.
- 9. Use a hose to check for deck leaks at ports and hatches. Renew caulk or gaskets as needed.

Outdrives and outboard engines:

- I. Inspect rubber outdrive bellows for cracked, dried or deteriorated spots (look especially in the folds); replace if suspect.
- 2. Check power steering and power trim oil levels.
- 3. Replace worn zincs.
- 4. Inspect the outer jacket of control cables. Cracks or swelling indicate corrosion; if present, the cable needs to be replaced.
