This program is designed to help the new boater get familiar with their own new boat (or larger/different one) with an experienced CSPS advisor present. It's free and covered by our liability policy. Basically, we meet with the New Boater at the launching ramp, conduct a safety inspection and then address the areas of 'their' concern on the water! Some requirements must be met, but overall, it's a fabulous service that helps new boaters while exposing them to what 'they don't know'! Allowing us to introduce them to our robust educational offerings along with a very positive 'fun-on-the-water experience'.

Your Executive Committee has lots of activities underway with the goal of bringing all of our administrative functions up to date: review and update of our Bylaws is being led by Harold Beidel; an audit of our financials is being completed under the seasoned supervision of Doug Jackson and Ralph Newman; scanning and purging of our historical records along with inventories of the

It is finally May and I am so excited to get out and enjoy the water with my friends and family! As we get ready for this season including all of the usual tasks we must do to get the boats and trailers ready, I would like to share an interesting article I read that reminded me of crew readiness.

The article brought back to my mind why we must give each member of our crew, including the new visitor(s), a job responsibility. By doing this, we keep our crew safe, our boat safe, and we get to look good when coming in or leaving the dock. These responsibilities can range from using a boat hook, knowing how to throw a line, appointing who is in charge of stowing the towels and shoes when underway - this may sound trivial but is very important so that we do not lose our belongings or litter the waterway. When assigning tasks to your crew, remember to assign tasks by each person's



ability level or the next level of activity in boating which you are trying to teach them.

When teaching each crew member what they need to do, it is also very important to remember to educate them on what to do if the driver of the boat has a medical emergency. This entails informing this person, as well as any other crew

member, where to take the boat for help. That place may not be your boat dock; a better choice would be the nearest gas dock because that is usually where you will find the most people to help you.

Hello again, from the Clubhouse office of the AO, Ruthie K. Wow, let me begin by saying thanks to Commander Dick for putting together a fantastic Steak Fry and Pot Luck at the Worthington American Legion. We had a great turnout of members, 27 in all. The past Commanders worked the grill and just like at the helm of their vessels they got the job done. They were as passionate about the meat that came off the grill as they are getting their boats from port to port and into a slip for the night. Great job guys! 


learn more about the operations of the squadron — and how to get things done, look for that free training. A big Thank You to all of our great volunteers and teachers who help make this all happen!

Ed Mack reported that the Morgan Stanley account is up and the budget is tracking as expected. Ed asked whether additional bids were requested for the photographs displayed at HQ. There were no other bids. Bob Goelz moved to pay the bill; 2nd Phil Osborne; passed.

#### Immediate Past Commander, P/C Ed Mack, SN

P/C Mack would like to know progress on plans for handling the Treasurer's position. He is trying to recruit someone to take the position. A conference call on the audit is scheduled.

#### **Members at Large Reports:**

Lt Sue Goelz, S: Sue reported on the issue involving payment by the squadron to the National Education Fund. There was a brief discussion. Phil Osborne moved to approve payment; 2nd Bob Goelz; passed.

Lt Michael T. Hughes, AP: For Boating Safety Week, Channel 6 is willing to do at least one feature such as VSE's. He will be meeting with the Ch. 6 representative again.

P/D/C Phil Osborne, JN-IN: We had a very good Spring Conference and D/Lt/C Mark Dahlmann did a great job in setting up seminars. D/1sL/Lt Carl Clair & D/1st/Lt Dennis Keyfauver gave a great seminar on Guidelines for using Boat Show Mini-Seminars and provided an outline from National for giving the one-hour presentations. Fort Wayne has come up with a Marketing Plan to include presenting mini-seminars at the Fort Wayne Boat Shows and they presented the program at the Spring Conference. I have provided a copy to the Squadron Educational Officer and one to our Marketing Chair for their preview. ODNR, Division of Wildlife gave a very informative presentation on the Magee Marsh in Ottawa County and on bird migration to the area as well as the eagle population and their nesting in Ohio and the white pelicans nesting on Green Island. We also had a Navigation Seminar where participations were on the Virtual Trainer, throwing lines, onboard emergencies and how to plan and prepare for such emergencies. Over-all, this was a great conference!

Columbus failed to donate to the National Educational Fund and we were the only squadron that did not receive a certificate. We also failed to receive an award for our WEB site.

During the District Cruise this year, we will have a representative from the Dept. of Natural Resources meet with us at the Huron Boat Basin on July 6th where we will sponsor a Sturgeon fish tag and release the fish into Lake Erie. Prior to the release a chip will be inserted into the fish so they can be monitored. This program has been in existence, and the district plans to have someone from National there and place pictures in the Ensign. If anyone is interested in this, please join us at the Huron Boat Basin in July.

Lt Beth Perchuk, P: Discussion of how to best send pictures of the highway clean up. Email seems best.

P/D/Lt Ruth Wilcox, S: The D29 Rendezvous ends at the Huron Boat Basin in July. Lima Power Squadron invites us to join them at Indian Lake on June 9.


